

Sign up for a reminder

Get notified the day before your collection. Search "Pomobile" on the Apple or Android app store, or go to portmoody.ca/recycle.

On your waste collection day:





Set out unlocked carts between 5:30am and 7:30am.



Put wheels against the curb or just off the roadway.



Leave at least one arm's length of space between carts.



On glass weeks, place your bin so it's the first thing our driver sees when approaching your house, followed by the smallest of your two carts.

Please remember:



Cart lids must close completely – do not overfill or overstuff.



We only collect waste in carts provided by the City no extra bags are collected.



Lock clips and secure carts as soon as possible after collection.



Keep bears away by rinsing carts frequently to reduce odours.

About your carts



About our waste collection program

- Set out unlocked carts at the curb between 5:30am–7:30am on your collection day, and re-lock and re-secure carts as soon as possible, and no later than 8pm. If your cart is not emptied by 8pm, bring it in and contact us.
- The City's Solid Waste Bylaw requires that you keep carts clean, locked and stored securely.
- Write your address on your cart and glass bin it helps staff assist with issues. If your cart is lost, stolen, or damaged, contact us immediately.

- Carts and your glass bin are property of the City of Port Moody. Clean them out and leave them for the next resident to avoid replacement costs.
- If you can't move your carts due to physical challenges, and don't have anyone to help, contact us about our pack-out service.

Re bear smart

Managing wildlife attractants properly is how we keep people and bears safe. Leaving carts unlocked on non-collection days and setting carts out too early are bylaw violations. If you don't manage your garbage and other wildlife attractants properly, you could be fined up to \$1,000 by the City.



Lock your carts, keep them secure, and rinse frequently



Set your carts out between 5:30am and 7:30am



Manage or put away your backyard attractants, like ripe fruit, BBQs, pet food, and bird feed

Aerosol cans and caps



Aluminum foil (take-out and baking containers)



Boxboard boxes (cereal boxes)



Cardboard



Cartons and jugs



Hot and cold drink cups and lids



Household paper, cards, paper gift wrap



K-Cups (no grounds put those in green waste)



Metal cans and lids



Microwavable bowls and cups



Moulded boxboard (egg cartons, beverage trays)



Multi-layered paper bags (flour, sugar)



Newspapers, flyers, magazines, phone books



Plastic bottles, tubs, jugs and jars with caps/lids



Plastic clamshells and trays



Plastic garden plant pots and seedling trays



Clear and coloured non-refundable glass (✓ if broken)



No lids – put these in your recycling



No refundable glass – this goes back to a depot for your refund



No dishes, mirrors, windows, or ceramics – put these in your garbage



Shredded paper (tie in a clear plastic bag)



Spiral wound paper cans and lids (frozen juice)



Tetra Pak boxes and cartons (soups, sauces)



Place clean recycling and glass directly in your cart and bin - no bags needed!

Green Waste



Butter, sauce, dressing, grease



Coffee grounds, filters, tea bags, leaves



Dairy and eggshells



Food scraps and spoiled food



Fruits, vegetables, nuts



Meat, fish, bones



Paper or cardboard take-out boxes, bags, and wooden chop sticks



Paper towels and napkins



Pasta and bread



Branches up to 4" round



Grass clippings, leaves, weeds



House plants (no pots or dirt)

Garbage



Blister packs (gum, pills)



Broken dishes



Diapers and sanitary waste



Furnace air filters



Hoses, tarps



Masks, gloves, wipes, Kleenex



Non-packaging plastic items



Pet waste and cat litter



Scrap metal items (pots, spatulas)



Straws and plastic cutlery



Tooth brushes and toothpaste tubes



Worn and unusable toys and footwear

- Put your item(s) out on the scheduled pickup date before 7am.
- Pay Waste Connections of Canada Inc. as directed by their staff at time of booking.

Reducing single-use items




The City of Port Moody has adopted a bylaw regulating single-use plastic and foam items to promote responsible and sustainable environmental practices. The Single-Use Plastic Bylaw came into effect on April 22, 2022 and bans distribution of the following items:

- Plastic checkout bags;
- Foam containers for prepared food;
- Plastic stir sticks; and
- Plastic drinking straws (except where required for accessibility needs)

Paper checkout bags and reusable checkout bags may be provided on request and at a charge of a minimum fee of \$0.25 per and \$2 respectively

Metro Vancouverites dispose of almost 1 billion single-use items per year. That's 390 bags, straws, utensils, cups, and containers per person. Single-use items are used for a short time, but they have a lasting impact on our environment.



Here are five quick tips from Metro Vancouver on reducing single-use items:



When ordering from your favourite restaurant, request that your meal is put in as few containers as possible.



Reduce utensil spam! When ordering takeout, opt for no cutlery or napkins included. (Check "no utensils" on your food delivery app, or request this over the phone.)



At the grocery store, don't use plastic produce bags.



If you drive, keep several reusable bags in your car, and store them there after each use.



Go strawless, or use a reuseable straw if possible. (Straws are an important accessibility tool. Only ask for a straw if you need one.)
