



## Kyle Centre Redevelopment – Round 2 public engagement coming in early 2026

### City to seek feedback on conceptual design for new community centre

The City of Port Moody is planning for the redevelopment of the Kyle Centre area, and the first step is a conceptual design for a new 30,000-square-foot community centre. Pending future funding, this new facility would replace the existing Kyle Centre (125 Kyle Street). The design will also include a new plaza and an expanded park.

In September/October 2025, during Round 1 public engagement, we gathered input from current Kyle Centre user groups, prospective future user groups, and the community at large. We asked participants to tell us about the types of activities and experiences they would like to see offered at the proposed new community centre. The input collected will inform the development of a recommended conceptual design that establishes the shape, function, and organization of the proposed new facility and surrounding spaces.

In early 2026, we'll share the recommended conceptual design with the community and ask for general feedback. # New Shoreline Trail boardwalk is open for all to enjoy



The new Shoreline Trail boardwalk is open to the public! Port Moody residents and visitors can connect with nature as they make their way across this landmark structure, which provides inclusive, climate-resilient public access to a popular waterfront view corridor. It also helps to protect a critical ecosystem area for fish, birds, and other wildlife. The new boardwalk replaces 440 metres of boardwalk, bridge, and gravel trail around Pigeon Cove at the end of Burrard Inlet's Port Moody Arm. Construction began in December 2023 and was completed in September 2025.

## The benefits of the new boardwalk include:

- **safety improvements** – the structure has been raised to address rising sea levels due to climate change, and railings have been added to improve safety;
- **accessibility** – the new boardwalk is wheelchair accessible with design elements, such as widening the boardwalk in some places and reducing the grade of the path at entry/exit points, that improve accessibility for all trail users;
- **ecosystem protection** – the elevated boardwalk design discourages unsafe access to tidal mudflats, helping to prevent disturbance and degradation of this sensitive habitat;
- **ecological restoration** – relocating bridge abutments away from creeks, transplanting existing vegetation, and planting native species contribute to the recovery and long-term health of the natural ecosystem;
- **climate change resilience** – the raised boardwalk is designed to withstand rising sea levels, enhancing the site's adaptability to climate-related impacts; and
- **longevity** – the boardwalk uses untreated Alaskan Yellow Cedar to meet sustainability goals and is expected to last 20–25 years. The galvanized steel piles provide a 50 to 75 year foundation, with wood sections able to be replaced as needed. Together, these materials create a long-lasting, eco-friendly structure.



Midway along the boardwalk, you'll find a new viewing platform. A collaborative project with *In the Presence of Ancestors*, it's the site of a new house post carved by artists from səlilwətət (Tsleil-Waututh Nation) in partnership with qicəy' (Katzie First Nation) community members including qicəy' Chief Grace George. Tasha Faye Evans, in collaboration with the Port Moody Ecological Society, has provided pivotal leadership for *In the Presence of Ancestors*. 


### Here are some ideas to help ensure your holiday décor is wildlife- and eco-friendly:

- use natural or biodegradable materials like wood, twine, cork, fabric, stones, seashells, or paper;
- recycle and upcycle – reimagine existing items to reduce waste;
- use scrap fabric to create unique and fun ornaments;
- create biodegradable garland from untreated wooden beads or dried flowers and leaves;
- make a simple dough out of flour, water, and salt – cut out fun shapes and bake; or
- use twigs and paint to create unique shapes and designs.

Be sure to avoid unsuitable materials such as glass (including glass bulbs or ornaments), Styrofoam, glitter, mesh/netting, tinsel, plastic garland, and latex or helium balloons. Despite even the best cleanup efforts, some of these materials can get left behind and persist for many years in our natural areas. Also, please do not include edible items (such as seeds, nuts, dog treats, or candy) in your décor, as these can be harmful to wildlife. Have fun decorating outdoors but remember that wildlife-friendly materials will help to keep our natural areas healthy and safe for everyone to enjoy.

Please collect any decorations you hang in Pioneer Memorial Park by February 14, 2026. The wire-framed sculptures will be removed after that date, and the potted trees will be planted at various locations around Port Moody.

# For a greener travel option, rent a shared e-scooter or e-bike



Looking for a cheaper, greener travel option to get you where you need to go? If you're 16 or older, you can now rent a shared e-scooter or e-bike in Port Moody. The majority of residents can find a parking location within 500 metres (a five- to 10-minute walk) of their home. Download the Lime app – and review safety rules at [portmoody.ca/escooters-ebikes](http://portmoody.ca/escooters-ebikes) – to get started.

E-scooter and e-bike sharing aims to: make it easier for people to access active travel modes that are more affordable and better for the planet; strengthen connections to transit hubs and popular destinations, and connections between neighbourhoods; and improve access and convenience for riders.

When you're finished your ride, park the Lime vehicle in a designated mandatory parking location. Lime advises that improperly parked vehicles may be subject to a warning or penalty. And be sure to stay in a designated cycling lane or as near as possible to the right side of the road – riding on sidewalks or crosswalks is not permitted.



## myPortMoody saves you time (and paper!)

Manage your City accounts easily and conveniently online, whether you're at home or on the go. Sign up at [my.portmoody.ca](http://my.portmoody.ca), our online service where you can find current and past bills (for accounts such as taxes and utilities), select e-billing to go paperless, and view your application history for permits and licences such as building permits, business licences, or dog licences. Once you've signed up, you can add accounts to your myPortMoody profile by using the folio/account numbers and access codes from your invoices. ### Help keep your dog safe – renew your licence

Did you know that if a lost dog is licenced, it's more likely to be reunited with its owner? Don't forget to renew your dog licence in the New Year! E-bills for licence renewal are sent out in early January. Paying on time pays – receive a discount if you renew by February 2, 2026. Visit [my.portmoody.ca](http://my.portmoody.ca) to pay online or head to City Hall to pay in person.

### Renew a business licence by February 2

Business licence renewals are due by February 2, 2026. Invoices are sent by email in January of each year – your previous year's business licence will remain valid until the payment deadline. Once you receive your e-bill, you can pay online quickly and easily at [my.portmoody.ca](http://my.portmoody.ca).

## E-scooter and e-bike safety – a message from Port Moody Police

Let's make sure everyone arrives home safely! The Port Moody Police Department is reminding e-scooter and e-bike riders that helmets are mandatory. Here are some additional safety rules to keep in mind: you must be at least 16 years old to ride; always follow the rules of the road; do not ride when impaired due to alcohol or drugs; ride solo – only one rider per vehicle is permitted; and put your phone and all other electronic devices away while operating a vehicle. # Stay safe in winter weather

Winter can bring all kinds of weather – heavy rain, wind storms, snow and ice, and freezing temperatures. Visit [portmoody.ca/hazards](http://portmoody.ca/hazards) for information on how to stay safe this winter.



## Heavy rain

Heavy rainfall can cause flooding, so please remember to clear catch basins near your home.

Remove leaves, branches, and other debris to prevent flooding on your street. Be aware of rising water levels near creeks or the inlet that can increase the risk of flooding and flow of debris. Keep children and pets away from watercourses.



## Wind storms

Strong winds can lead to power outages, property damage, and blocked roads due to fallen trees or branches. If you see a downed power line, assume the line is live and stay back at least 10 metres. A downed or damaged power line is an emergency – call 9.1.1 for help. Report fallen trees, branches, and other debris on municipal property by calling 604.469.4574 or submitting a form at [portmoody.ca/reportaproblem](http://portmoody.ca/reportaproblem).



## Extreme cold

Monitor alerts and forecasts issued by Environment Canada so you can prepare for freezing temperatures.

Anyone looking for a place to warm up is welcome to visit the public areas of the Recreation Complex (300 loco Road) or the Civic Centre (100 Newport Drive) during regular operating hours. If you need help or information for vulnerable individuals, consider calling 2.1.1 or visiting [bc.211.ca](http://bc.211.ca) online to learn about available community resources.



## Snow and ice


Help us keep sidewalks clear and safe! Residents, strata corporations, and businesses are responsible for removing snow and ice from sidewalks bordering their property within 24 hours, or by 10am if the property is on a Priority Pedestrian Route. The list of Priority Pedestrian Routes can be found at [portmoody.ca/snowandice](http://portmoody.ca/snowandice). Remember to clear accessibility ramps for walkways and accessible parking spots to ensure access for all.

## Hosting guests for dinner? Stay alert when cooking

Cooking brings family and friends together, especially over the holidays. But did you know that improper use of cooking appliances is the number one cause of home fires and home injuries? Port Moody Fire Rescue is reminding everyone to stay alert when cooking to stay safe.

Reduce distractions and remain in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove. Use a timer to remind you that you're cooking and keep anything that can catch fire – such as oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, dishcloths, or towels – away from your stovetop. If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol, leave the cooking for another time. If there is a fire in your kitchen, leave and call 9.1.1. from outside the home.

It's also important to make sure you have smoke alarms installed, and to make sure they're working. Test and clean all smoke alarms on a regular basis. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for testing, maintenance, battery replacement, and alarm expiration.
